WOODLAND HILLS CONSIDERING TAX INCREASE



Woodland Hills School District is considering a property tax increase for property owners in the district. The gap in the budget would be covered by raising the millage rate from 25.35 to 29.83 mills for the school year 2017-18.

The district is seeking an Act I exemption from the PA Department of Education to raise the real estate property tax as reflected in the preliminary budget.

Budget workshops are open to the public taxpayers on March 7, April 6, & May 9 at 6:00 PM at the Woodland Hills High School Media Center.

NEIGHBORHOOD ISSUES

Abandoned illegal vehicles and property code violations can be reported so it is addressed by the borough.

Many residents allow vehicle inspections and registrations to expire while keeping the vehicles on public streets or private property. This situation diminishes the quality of the neighborhood.

The police department has recently tagged numerous vehicles that were reported throughout the borough.



REWARD SEEKING ANSWERS



North Braddock suffered a tragedy on February 15, 2016 on Jones Avenue. Someone broke into the home of 92 year old Amelia Roman, bound her limbs with duct tape, and left her to die in her lifelong home. Investigative leads have been exhausted with no arrests made. Marty Griffin from KDKA TV is now working with police investigators to bring answers for the grieving family. The home burglary went too far and resulted in the loss of life for an innocent resident. Someone in the community knows what went on during that February day in 2016. A \$5,000 reward has been offered for legitimate tips leading to an arrest.
