NORTH BRADDOCK RESIDENT GUIDE

Welcome to North Braddock. The community was incorporated in 1897 with a borough government system. An annual budget over \$3.1 million serves approximately 4,800 residents (2010 census). Affordable housing, close commute to Pittsburgh, nearby highways/interstates, close public transit, and the historic presence make North Braddock an attractive community.

COUNCIL MEETINGS:

Council publicly meets the third Tuesday of every month at 6:30pm. One mayor and nine council members are elected for representation.

TRASH COLLECTION:

BIG's Sanitation is contracted. Tuesdays, Ward 2 & 3 pickup. Wednesdays Ward 1 pickup. One day delay on holiday weeks. All trash cans to be returned off the sidewalk after collection.

E-WASTE RECYCLING:

Drop off electronic items such as TV's at the borough lot E-Waste dumpster. Don't leave at the curb, it will not be collected.

CURFEW ORDINANCE:

Anyone under 18 years of the age is prohibited from loitering in the borough after 10:00pm.

VOTING LOCATIONS:

Registered voters vote every May & November at the polls.

PUBLIC LIBRARY:

Braddock Carnegie Library is free to the public at 419 Library Street in Braddock Borough.

PARKS:

Three public parks are used by residents. Ridgeview Drive Park, Brinton Avenue Park, & Bell Avenue Park. Gardweeno is a community garden on Bell Avenue.

POLICE:

NBPD consists of a chief, sergeant, and patrol officers to serve & protect. At least two officers are staffed on every shift for 24 hours a day.

EMS:

Priority One EMS is contracted to provide ALS & BLS ambulance crews for medical emergencies. Call (412) 271-2171 with any questions.

FIRE:

NBVFD is led by five operational officers with a staff of volunteer firefighters trained for fire & rescue emergencies.

COUNTY 911:

Allegheny County 911 handles all emergency call taking and dispatching. Call 911 to report any emergency 24 hours a day.

STREET DEPARTMENT:

NBSD has a supervisor and five full time laborers. The NBSD provides maintenance for parks, roads, storm drains, and other infrastructure.

CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Code enforcement has one full time code official for building inspection, permits, and enforcing all property codes.

TAX COLLECTOR:

One elected tax collector has part-time office hours to handle local tax issues.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH:

Residents report suspicious acts. Active Nextdoor social media groups provide neighbor interaction.

BOROUGH MANAGER:

Borough manager oversees the budget, finances, and daily borough business.

ANIMAL CONTROL:

Sable Kennel is contracted to handle all animal control issues.

VOLUNTEER GROUPS:

North Braddock Cares works on projects, holds community events, and meet monthly. Garden Club meets monthly & works to beautify the town.

SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Woodland Hills School District serves the local students (K-12 grades) in a large district of approx. 4,000 students.

MAGISTRATE:

Elected magistrate judge Scott Schricker presides over all local court hearings in Turtle Creek Borough.

US POST OFFICE:

Braddock Post Office at 1110 Braddock Avenue provides mail delivery and services to the residents.

UTILITIES:

Peoples Gas, Duquesne Light, Verizon, Comcast, Wilkinsburg Penn Joint Water Authority & ALCOSAN are serving the area.

GOLF COURSE:

Grand View Golf Club is a local gem for playing, dining, and sight-seeing. The 18-hole course & restaurant is open to the public.
